LOCAL PERKS AND KNOWLEDGE

Puerto Rico is a United States territory and this means that you can enter Puerto Rico if you are a United States citizen or you hold a valid United States visa. The currency used in Puerto Rico is the dollar. When in Puerto Rico, make sure to hold some cash with you as some vendors only accept cash but this is only a small percentage as most of the city is card friendly.

There is so much culture and history in Puerto Rico. The food, the people and the music. It is a great destination all year round but be mindful of the swift weather changes. One minute it is blazing hot, the next minute it is raining but the rain only lasts a few minutes before the sun comes out again. Be sure to have raincoats or umbrellas as well as sunglasses and hats especially in December.

One thing I really loved about Puerto Rico and a stand-out feature for me was the fusion between Spanish and American influences. The product is often times a rich authentic vibe that's both new and fresh and leaves you wanting to explore. So go on, explore but not after reading this guide.

BEFORE YOU GO

I. WHAT TO TAKE

Sunscreens, Bikinis, Shorts, Hats and other tropical weather friendly clothing. Umbrellas, Rain shoes for when it rains unexpectedly. Hiking shoes for El Yunque Rainforest. Comfortable flat shoes and sandals for exploring the city by foot. Driver's license if you need to rent a car. Cash and credit card. Dollar is the currency. Bug spray because there are a lot of bugs in Puerto Rico. Of course, Camera to capture the awesome memories.

II. GETTING AROUND

Public transportation in Puerto Rico is not very efficient. However, there are many other ways to get around town. When in San Juan, taxis and Ubers are the best bet, with Uber being the better option as they are cheaper and quicker. If venturing out of San Juan, for example, to El Yunque Rainforest and Fajardo, make sure to rent a car from Enterprise-Rent-a-Car. A Regular car costs about \$45 and it is by far the best option compared to tours of \$200 with little or no flexibility.

III. MONEY AND TIPPING

Credit cards are accepted in most places but be sure to carry spare cash for a few street vendors who sell tasty street food or for payment of tolls when venturing outside San Juan. For currency exchanges, it is best to go to the mall or certified and safer locations. Avoid exchanging money on the streets. Puerto Ricans like to be tipped (who doesn't?) and they deserve it because most of the service you experience will be great service. Say thank you with a good tip.

IV. SAFETY AND SECURITY

Puerto Rico is a relatively safe country but just like every other country you visit, you should take precaution especially as a tourist. First, you do not have to wear it on your sleeve that you are a tourist. Be confident even when you feel lost and avoid dark spots and areas with sketchy wifi connections. In general, use your good judgement and keep the lines of communication open with your loved ones at home.

If you do not go anywhere in Puerto Rico, go to Flamenco Beach. It is one of the most beautiful beaches in the world. Note that Flamenco beach is not in the popular San Juan. pan. You will have to access it by ferry or by air. If by Ferry, catch an early one at 9am from Fajardo to Culebra and enjoy the amazing view. The ferry terminal now sells a return ticket which costs about \$13 per person. If you usually experience sea sickness, make sure to get a pressure band. There are a couple of bars and nice places to get great Puerto Rican food at Flamenco beach so leave your food at home.
